WHAT IS ICP?

Indigenous Community Planning (ICP) is a two-year concentration in the dual accredited Masters of Community and Regional Planning (MCRP) program at SCARP. ICP blends Indigenous knowledges and planning with contemporary planning methods and offers education grounded in community experience and knowledge sharing.

WHO IS ICP?

ICP attracts both Indigenous and non-Indigenous students from a range of academic and professional backgrounds, with ten students accepted each year. ICP students learn how to work in a good way through an eight-month practicum working with a host First Nation's community and supporting their own **comprehensive community planning (CCP) process**.

WHY ICP?

Host communities benefit by receiving consistent assistance with their community planning processes and needs, and increasing the community's existing planning capacity and skills. Students gain invaluable experience by deepening their understanding of Indigenous ways of planning.
